**ORDER GRANTING APPLICATION TO APPROVE NOTICE
AND SET CLAIMS FILING DEADLINE**

The Court considered the *Application to Approve Notice and Set Claims Filing Deadline* (the "Application"), filed by CANTILO & BENNETT, L.L.P., solely in its capacity as Special Deputy Receiver of Santa Fe Auto Insurance Company, (the "SDR" and "SFAIC" respectively). After considering the Application, the evidence submitted, and the recommendation of the Special Master appointed in this proceeding (the "Master"), the Court finds as follows:

1. The *Amended Order of Reference to Master* (the "Order of Reference") provides that the Application is referred to the Master;
2. The Application was submitted to the Master in accordance with the Order of Reference;
3. Notice of the Application was provided in accordance with TEX. INS. CODE §443.007 (d) and the Order of Reference, and no objections to the Application were filed;
4. The Texas Property and Casualty Insurance Guaranty Association filed its Acknowledgment and Waiver to the Application.

5. The Master has issued a recommendation that the Application should be granted pursuant to Rule 171 of the Texas Rules of Civil Procedure;
6. The Court has jurisdiction over the Application and the parties in interest; and
7. The Application should be GRANTED in all respects.


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED ADJUDGED AND DECREED as follows:

1. The Application is GRANTED;
2. The Court approves the notice to the parties described in this Application, and finds that such notice complies with the requirements of TEX. INS. CODE § 443.155(a) and due process;
3. The Court approves the Liquidation Notice attached as Exhibit 1 and the Publication Notice attached as Exhibit 2, and finds that notices substantially similar to such exhibits comply with the requirements of TEX. INS. CODE § 443.155(b);
4. The Court approves the POC form attached as Exhibit 3, and finds that a form substantially similar to such exhibit complies with the requirements of TEX. INS. CODE § 443.252;
5. The Court sets **October 5, 2014** as the Claims Filing Deadline for the filing of POCs;
6. The Court approves the claims processing procedures as described in the Application;
7. The Court finds that all claimants who assert a third party claim against a Santa Fe policyholder who file a POC with the SDR shall be deemed to have released and waived any claim against the Santa Fe policyholder up to the amount of

policy limits of the Santa Fe insured's policy;

8. This Order constitutes a final judgment fully resolving all issues relating to the Application, provided that this Court shall retain jurisdiction to issue further orders pursuant to TEX. INS. CODE Chapter 443. This Order shall not affect, in any way, the Receiver's and SDR's immunities from suit and shall not give rise to any right to sue or create any causes of action against the Receiver or the SDR. The automatic stay, the permanent injunction and the other provisions of the Receivership Order remain in affect unless expressly modified herein.
